September	 September Dues Renewals Submit club dues renewals to WHQ – preferably online – before October 1 For those clubs who were also on time with their May/June officer lists, Goal #10 is complete. 	
October- Start of November	 Hall of Fame Education Award Recognition Friends encourage friends to give manual speeches. Club members complete at least 2 educational goals by Beginning of November (2 of Goals #1, #2, #3, or #4) Now that there are no fall conferences moving forward, encourage members attend any form of District events such as TLI where they can be recognized for their educational achievements. 	
November	Leadership Lessons: Two past officers present the four fundamentals For those looking to complete the traditional program, schedule two past officers (who attended officer training while in office AND have completed their Competent Leader manual) to present two each of the four recommended Educational modules to your members and submit for their ALB award. Goals #5 & #6 are complete. Suggested Educational manuals are: Finding New Members Evaluate to Motivate Mentoring Moments of Truth	Ensure Area Director submitted their visit report before Nov. 30
December – January	 Mid-Year (Winter) – Focus on finishing strong Be proactive – Club officers review the club success plan and make necessary adjustments Ensure at least four club officers attend second-round club officer training at Winter TLI 2nd ½ of Goal #9. For returning officers, it is an opportunity to get answers to tougher questions and to share your knowledge with new officers. Encourage other club members to attend the TLI too for information, leadership tips that they can use in the workplace, and networking opportunities Celebrate being halfway there! Recognize members who have achieved educational goals Be proactive, start looking for your successor – delegate more of your duties to the VP-Ed Encourage other officers to also start looking for their successor if they will not be continuing in their role for another term Set up the elections committee and appoint the past president as the chair. For newly chartered clubs, the charter president will have to chair Conduct a specially themed open house event in January to attract new members Have VP-Education reach out to Area Director to get a date for the spring Area contest and use that to schedule Spring Club Area Contest – VP of Education should appoint Contest Chair and work with them to start reaching out to judges and motivating members to participate in club contests. April - May	 Hall of Fame Education Award Recognition: Spring Conference Friends encourage friends to give manual speeches. Club members complete at least 2 educational goals by Spring Conference (2 of Goals #1, #2, #3, or #4) Ensure members attend conferences and get recognized for their educational achievements. 	
May - June	Beat the Clock: May-June May - Continue to focus on finishing strong Hold Club Officer Elections at the first business meeting in May Have secretary to immediately submit incoming Club Officer lists through Club central and provide your Area Director with a copy for onward transmission to the District (do it by May 31 to beat the rush!) – ½ Goal #10 for the next Toastmaster year! Organize additional meeting to help those close to completing their educational goals Appoint socials committee to organize club's end-of-year celebrations in June June - Help incoming officers head for a great start June - Motivate them to attend Summer Toastmaster Club Officer Training at TLI - have 4 or more officer attend - ½ of Goal #9 for the next Toastmaster year! Organize additional meeting to help those close to completing their educational goals	Ensure Area Director submits their visit report by May 31

Educational	Number of advanced speeches delivered per meeting	Minimum of one AC speech every other meeting and 1 qualifying educational every other month	2 AC's are required for DCP goals 3 and 4 which is equal to 20 speeches (for ACB, ACS and ACG) and 4 Educationals (if both are ACS and ACG)
Educational	Number of CL eligible roles signed up for per meeting	Minimum of 2 eligible roles signed up for by 2 members who plan not to miss more than 4 meetings in a TM year	2 CL's are required for DCP goals 5 and 6. This is equal to 38 eligible roles completed 2 individuals in average of 40 meetings for community clubs
Membership	Number of guests showing up per meeting Number of guests converted to members in a month	Minimum of 1-2 guests visiting per meeting or 5 guests per month Minimum of 1 guest converted to a member in a month	8 new members are required for goals 7 and 8. Conversion rate of guests to members is about 20%
Training	Number officers who will attend Club officers training in round 1 and 2	Minimum of 4 officers will be attending each round of training	Minimum of 4 officers attending round 1 and round 2 achieves goal 9
